The following practices described on this page have been implemented by Nextera Communications to help prevent toll fraud.

- All international calling (countries dialed via 011) will automatically be blocked for new customers. Customers can contact their Nextera Account Executive or contact Customer Support to make International Calling available.
- The high-fraud countries listed below are blocked regardless of whether a customer has requested international calling availability:
